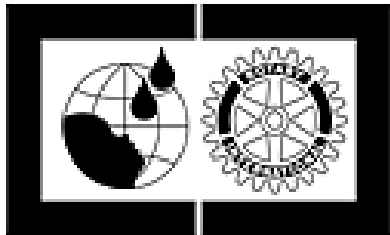

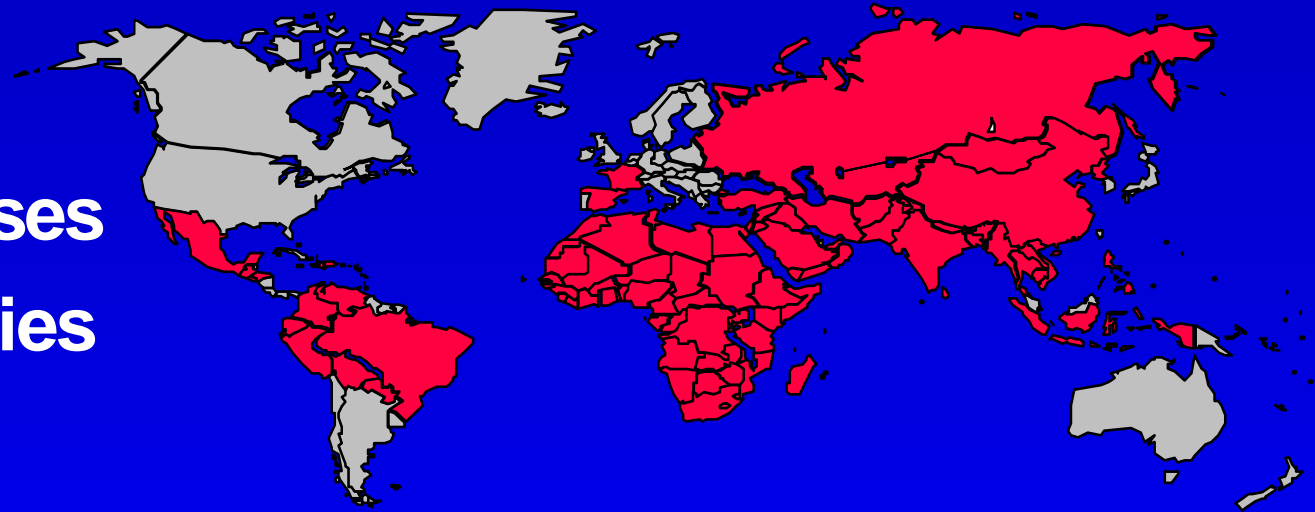

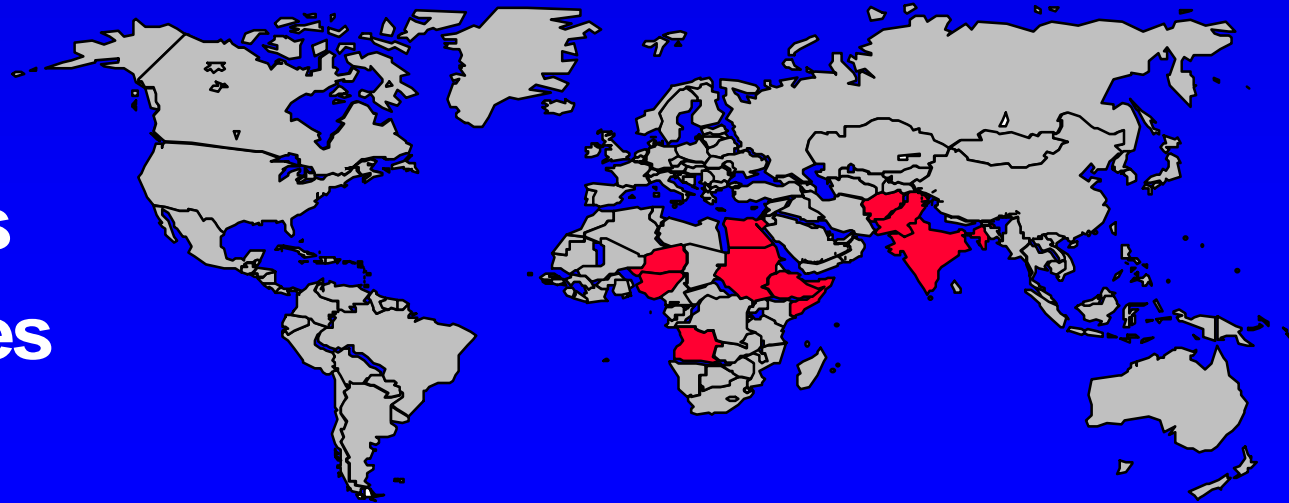

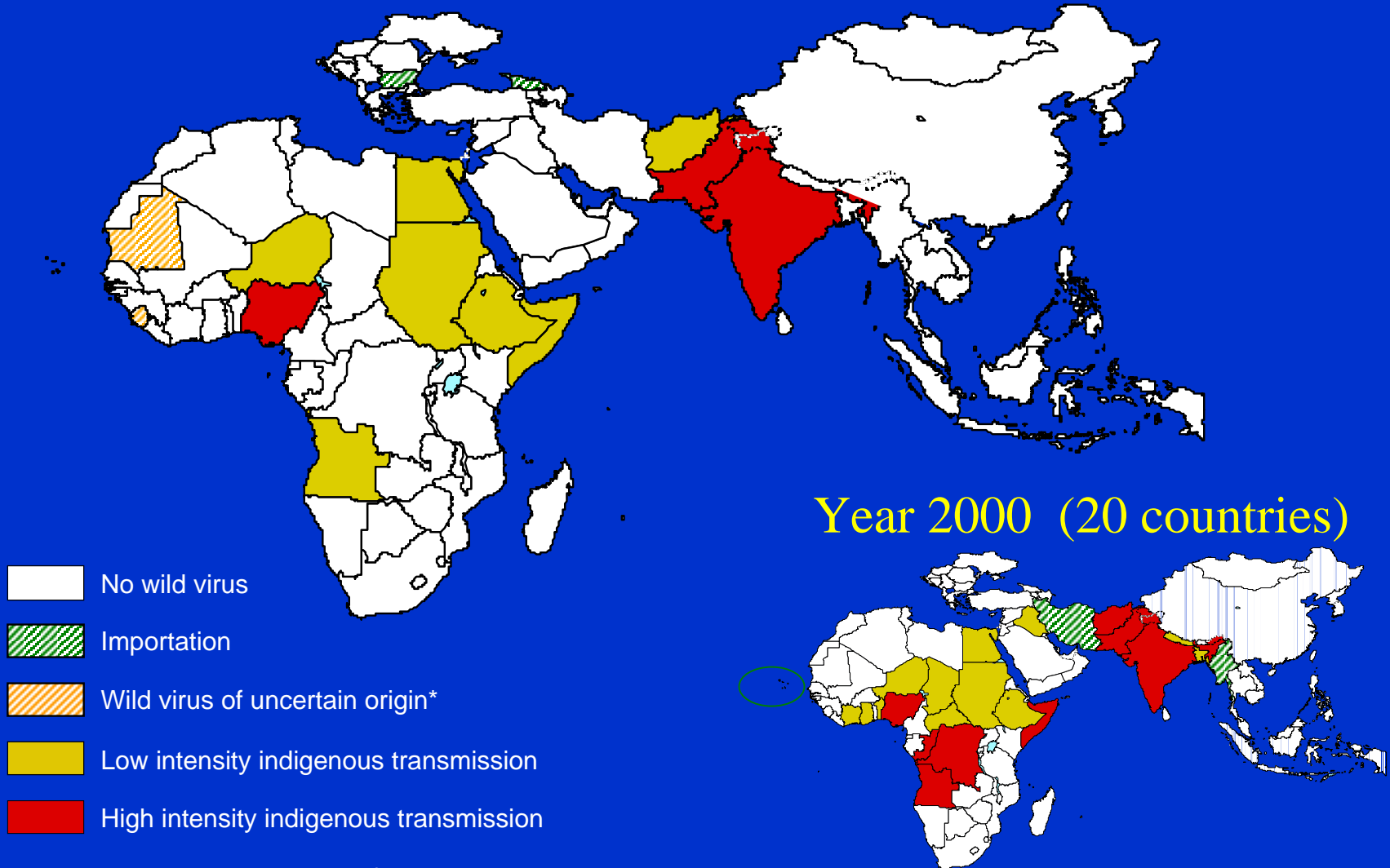

* the response to wild viruses of uncertain origin is as per indigenous wild virus.

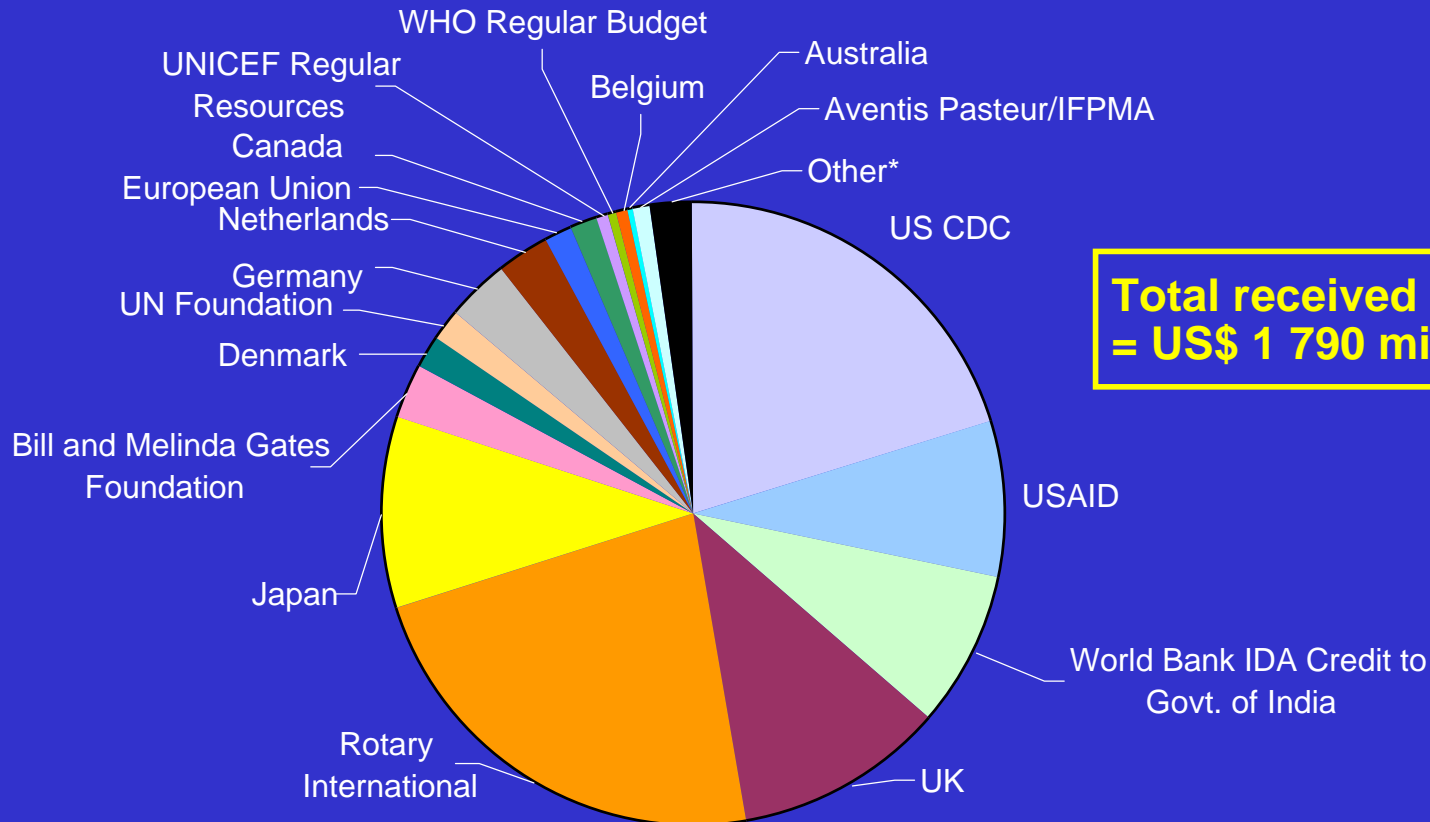
Note. Low intensity is < 20 wild viruses, high intensity is \geq 20 wild viruses.

Donor contributions to polio eradication, 1985-2001

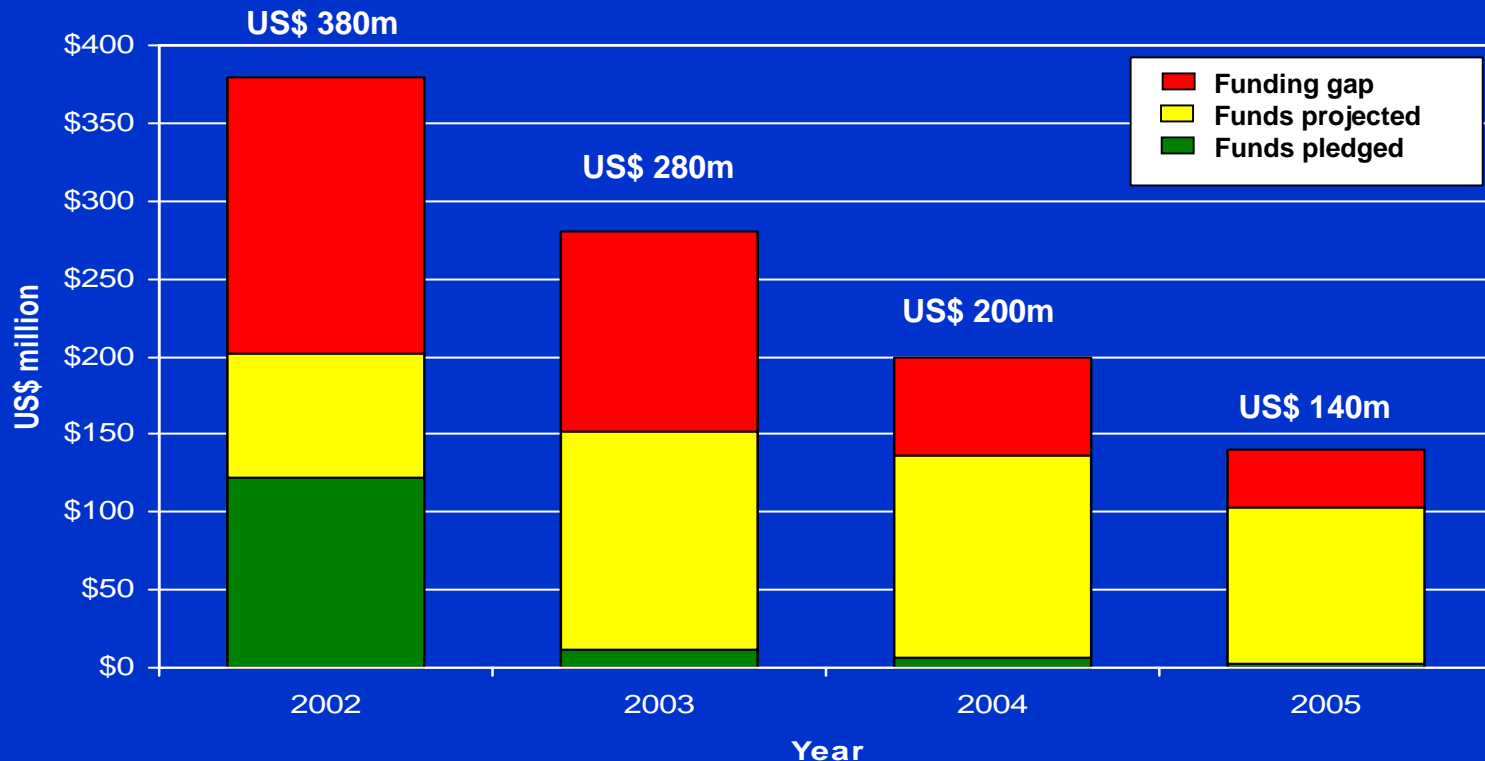

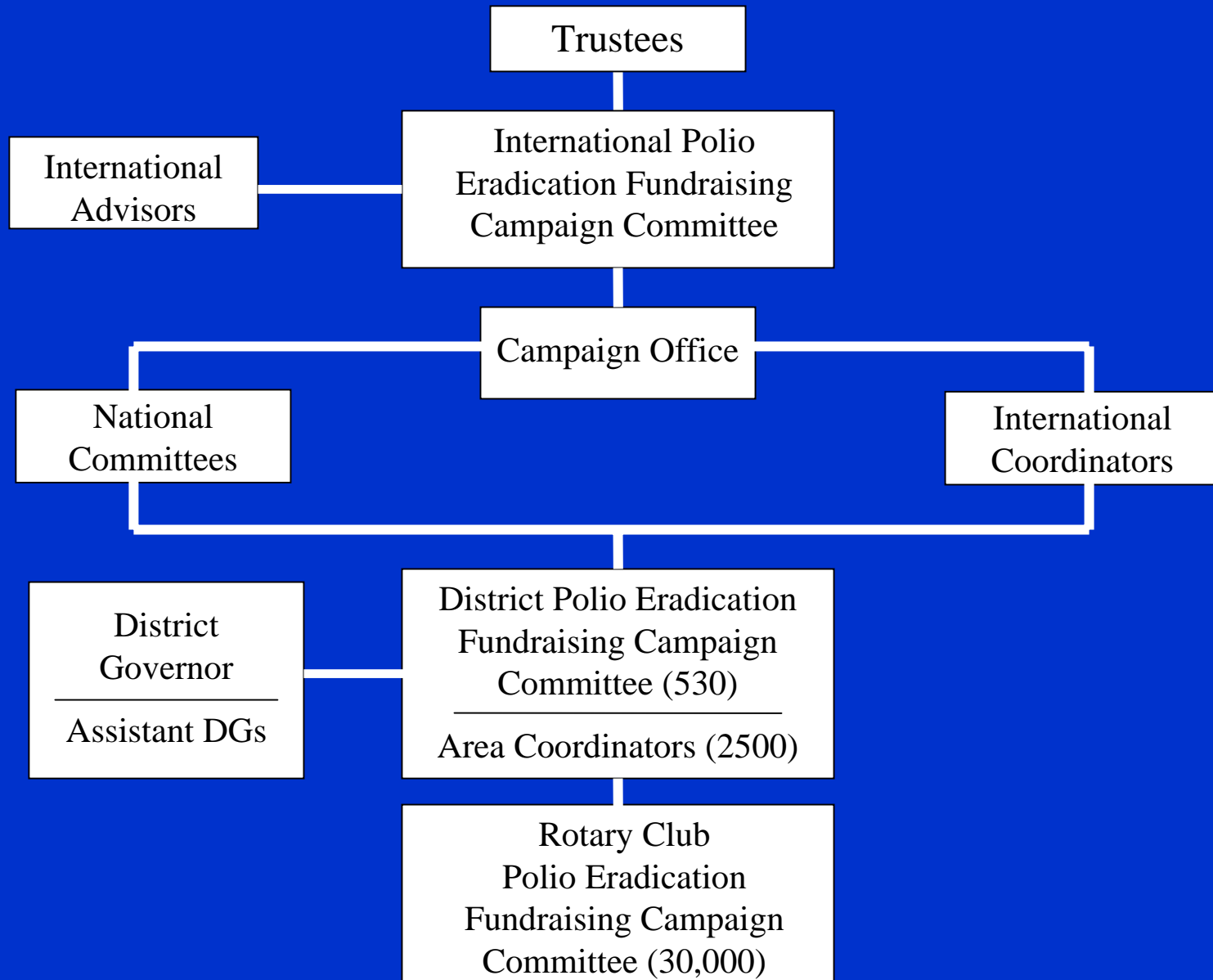

Rotary clubs of Pakistan help immunize more than 30 million children against polio

ISLAMABAD, Pakistan – 21 November 2010: Nearly one thousand Rotary volunteers from 84 clubs helped immunize more than 30 million children under five years of age against polio during the annual national immunization day (NID) in Pakistan.

"Such progress has been made in the fight against this crippling disease over the last year," said Abdul Hery Khan, Rotary's national PolioPlus chairman for Pakistan. "Polio cases have decreased by nearly 95 percent in Pakistan."

The Pakistan NID, launched on 7 November, was synchronized with Afghanistan to ensure that children among the displaced Afghan population in both sides of the border are protected from the crippling disease.

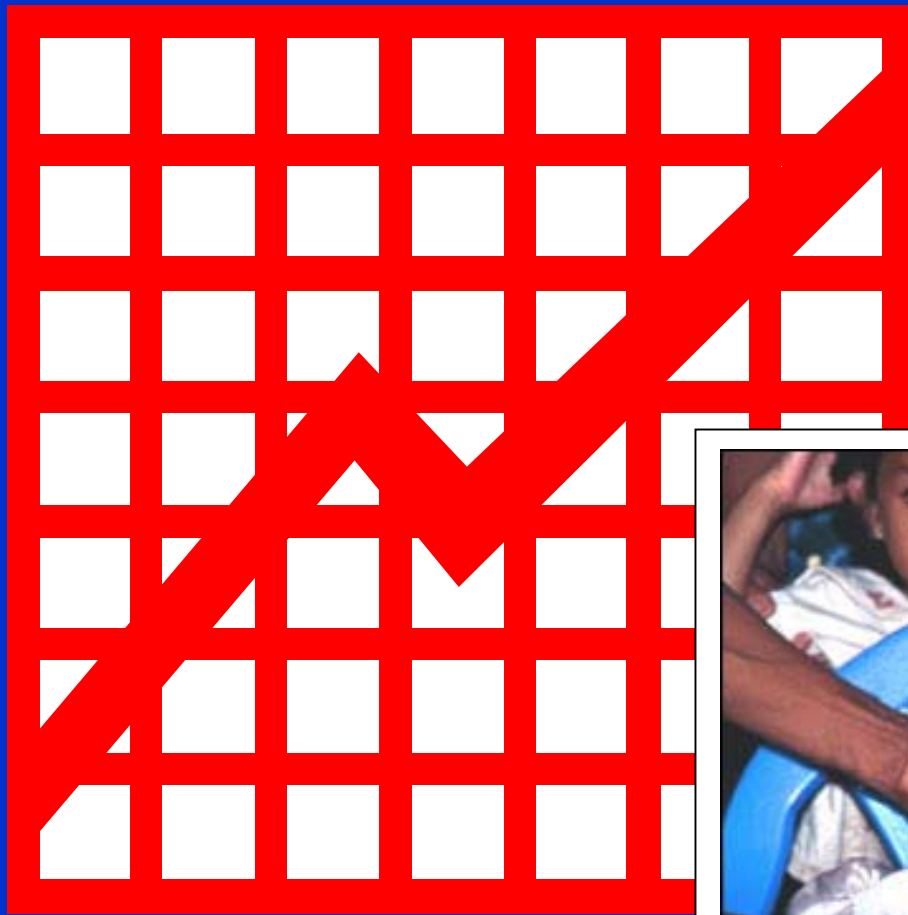

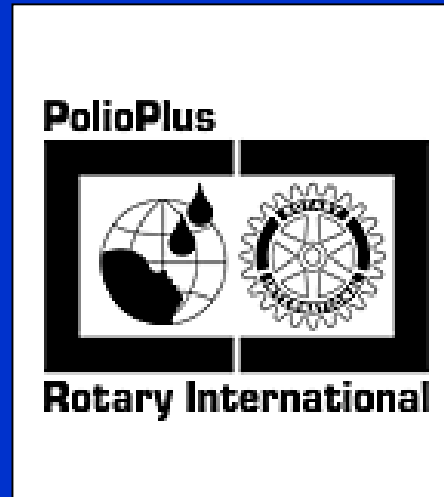
